Board Briefs January 12, 2016

Update on York County footbridge: The study that was done said that our dam is stable. The dam will be mowed and photos taken before York Co. starts on pilings. QL can restrict the use of the bridge. A motion was made and passed to accept the proposed easement offer for the bridge and the payment of \$50,000 from York County.

Limbs Trimmed: Heavy limbs hanging over the parking lot were trimmed. Micah's Service did the final leaf clean-up of the parking lot area in early December.

Newsletter: Our ads pay for the newsletter and bring in more money than it costs for the newsletter.

Path: The National Park Service superintendent is open to ideas and discussion with the community regarding finding a way to provide a pass through for foot traffic to the parkway to help residents avoid having to use Lakeshead Drive.

Clarke Aqua Management treated the lake on Dec. 9th for Curlyleaf Pondweed with herbicide.

Holcomb Boat Access plans are in the works for a new path and additional boat racks to be done this spring at other accesses.

A motion was made and passed to reduce the ramp fee for selfpropelled watercraft to \$15 per household for Queen's Lake Members.

A motion was made and approved the Director's Handbook updated in 2016.

Board Briefs February 9, 2016

The Clubhouse had to cancel and refund two rentals over the snow filled weekend last month.

Clarke Lake Management will be taking water samples next week and sending the samples to be analyzed for residual amounts of the Tradewind herbicide.

A motion was made and passed to approve the new Self Propelled Watercraft form and the new Ramp form.

Getting plans for the new kiosk and the pool committee is preparing to hire pool guards.

Tennis committee will schedule an introductory lesson in Pickleball and have tennis lessons in the spring.

Based on response from the last QLCA Board meeting, we are pursuing a simple opening of access for foot traffic at the end of East Queens Drive so that pedestrian traffic can get to the Parkway instead of needing to transit Lakeshead Drive.

February 25th – Attended the York County HOA meeting. The meeting focused on storm water management. The county outlined their role in managing storm water. They also clarified that if the storm water involves public roads, it is a VDOT, not York County issue. Also, if the county doesn't own land adjacent to retention ponds, they have a very limited role.

The county also talked generally about various topics. The overall tax base for our county went up approximately 1.5%, which combined with the delayed closure of a power plant resulted in the county administrator submitting a budget that didn't require previously anticipated cuts in county services.

The county also explained their role in mosquito management. They have been planning for the upcoming season, including reducing risk from the Zika virus.

Lake

Lake Management On 2-23-2016 Clarke preformed the first of 8 maintenance checks of Queens Lake and Princess Pond for 2016. There will be one visit the 1st and 4th quarter and then monthly starting April to September. During each visit water samples are taken from both the lake and pond, aerators are checked and serviced, and physical conditions of the water bodies are recorded.

Pond Weed Also on Feb. 23 water samples were gathered and sent to a lab to measure the residual amounts of the TradeWind Herbicide. The results of the tests show that the original 30 PPB from the Dec. 10th application now ranges 4 PPB at the upper end of the lake to just under 6 PPB at the bottom of the lake. The goal was to have levels above 5PPB. Even though Pondweed is hardly visible from docks or the shore, viable pieces of the plant still exist in the deeper water and for that reason a small bump treatment is scheduled soon. This bump treatment will kill the remaining pond weed and prevent it from maturing and reproducing.

Holcomb Boat Access Plans are being finalized and material cost estimates gathered to upgrade the boat access. When complete this access will have a new path, brush cleared from the dock allowing full access and additional boat racks constructed. We plan to start work in April.

Princess Pond Weeds and brush need to be cleared from the dam bank and at the water's edge. The spillway on the Will Scarlett side of the dam also needs to be cleared and be made workable so that the pond doesn't top over the dam during large storms. Additional boat racks are also in the works.

Main Dam Several erosion issues have been identified on the dam under the guardrail near the spillway. VDOT is being contacted to correct the problem.

2016 Boat Stickers All registered boats need to display the RED 2016 decal. The lake committee will do a compliance check starting in April.


