President's Message

Queens Lake is getting ready for the summer.

It's been a busy winter and spring in Queens Lake especially with regards to Phase III of the I-64 widening project. The I-64 committee must be commended for the excellent job they did representing our community. In April, they met with VDOT, York County and Senator Monty Mason and led them on a tour of the headwaters of Queens Lake. In May they held a very informative meeting at the clubhouse, coordinated a letter writing campaign (more than 200 submitted) and made sure the neighborhood turned out for VDOT's meeting May 18th. Thank you to all who wrote letters and attended the meeting.

The sewer project, begun last year, continues to work its way through the west side. Trenching work on the side streets was completed earlier this spring and continues on West Queens with two crews working toward each other. We can expect the side streets to be paved in the coming month if the weather cooperates. Most of the work on the bridge was completed this spring. It will open soon when the contractor completes work on the pipe. As further information becomes available it will be sent out via email, posted on Facebook and put on queenslake.net.

Many thanks to all the committee members and volunteers who have donated their time this winter and spring to make our neighborhood better.

Community Affairs

Tom Rooks: Director

An I-64 expansion task force has held several meetings with state and local level officials, VDOT employees and outside agencies that are experts in the appropriate fields related to the project. The task force led a community meeting May 2nd to put out detailed information and address community concerns on the topic. At the meeting, other community topics were presented including issues regarding the lake and the marina. The meeting was very well attended by our residents and State Senator Monty Mason and Delegate Brenda Pogge.

The VDOT pubic meeting regarding phase three of the expansion on May 18th at Bruton High School had 311 people attend. Thanks to all Queens Lakers who showed up and voiced their opinion.

The I-64 Task Force has requested \$420 to have a two hour consultation on sound mitigation by ACENTECH (acoustician company out of Boston that has been giving us free advice). They've been very helpful to us, but for us to get more in depth information from them, this would be the minimum to look into our particular situation. Also, knowing that amount of administrative work put in by the group for mailing letters, printing maps, and other costs, I want to look into methods to pay for and authorization to pay for these items.

MARCH 14, 2017 Board Briefs

Full minutes of all meetings are available for review by members in good standing at the office.

Motion was made and approved the February 20th Board Minutes.

HR policies and procedures for all employees and policies for employees working as independent contractors will be completed in 60 days.

Finance Director, John Kueser resigned as of March 7th. Notice will be sent out to members for a replacement.

Beds have been mulched and tree in back of the clubhouse will be trimmed. A memorial Dogwood tree was planted.

QL Day plans have been discussed and plans are underway.

Website for charging is being discussed.

VDOT will be holding the first public hearing for phase 3 of I-64 expansion on May 18th, from 4-7pm at Bruton High School. QL has an I-64 Committee working with VDOT.

Erosion issues have been identified on the dam under the guardrail near the spillway. VDOT will correct the problem. Oil slick on the lake is from an underground oil tank. Donation letter will be sent to all Lake property owners who are not QLCA members.

The bridge will be for members only. Rules and regulations will be brought to the Board for approval.

Marina committee will hire a structural engineer to conduct a structural review of the boathouse. Boathouse will be closed for now.

One Judgement was filed for 2016.

June 3 is set for Member Social.

Membership committee would like one path to membership as Deeded. This would go in the Bylaws.

Pool preparations have begun.

Motion was made and passed to approve the new Swim Team form and new fee per child of \$75.00.

Motion was made and passed approving Tom Rooks as Vice President.

APRIL 11, 2017 Board Briefs

Motion was made and approved the March 14, 2017 Board Minutes.

Vote was taken between 3 candidates for Finance Director. Gordon Angles was elected.

York Co. is getting bids to pave the streets.

Members will be notified about the problems with the Marina boathouse.

Membership committee will plant more daffodils in the fall.

New Social coming: Cinco de Mayo

Oil tank causing oil slick has been removed.

Donation Letters: To date we have received \$400.

The holes identified in the dam inspection report will be filled with a geotechnical sealant called Aquablock.

Inspections of the spillway are done once a year by VDOT and the committee will get a copy of the most recent report.

I-64 Transportation Committee The committee has already met twice this month. The committee has a set of preliminary VDOT plans for Phase III which are 30% of final design.

Committee will be working to get a sound wall.

Signs and Safety The sheriff's office has recommendations for phrasing on new signs for the bridge.

Bridge signs were approved by consensus. No objections from Board members.

The QLCA board will be hosting a community meeting on May 2nd at 6:30pm to share the status of the various important issues we are currently facing including the sewer project, the pedestrian bridge construction, I-64 expansion, and other issues.

The marina committee is currently working on the boathouse rebuild/removal. Engineering review was available to the Board.

Preparations for the 2017 pool season and swim team are continuing. Chemicals have been delivered and hiring guards.

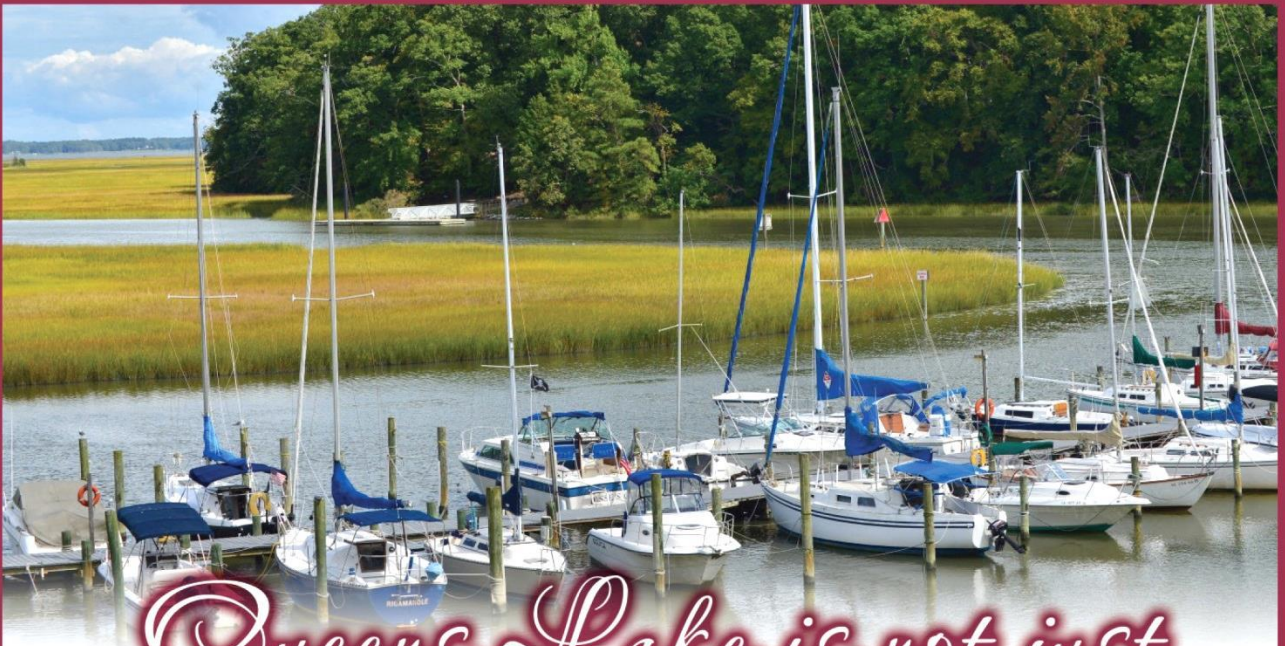

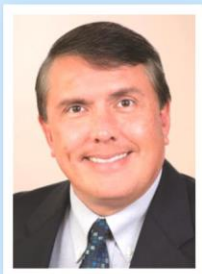

Beautification

It's the busy season for the Beautification Committee! Plants surrounding the clubhouse have been pruned and common areas are weeded and tended regularly by volunteers. The stunning cherry tree behind the clubhouse has been pruned back but still offers a shaded haven overlooking the marina.

West Queens Dr. residents are reminded to remove yard debris from the roadside during this last stretch of the sewer project. Please continue to fight the spread of ivy on trees and plants. While it is a good ground cover when controlled, this aggressive invader quickly takes over when unattended. We've noticed poison ivy is prolific this year, often hiding among the regular ivy.

TIPS ON REMOVING POISONIVY

- Dress for the battle. Wear long pants tucked into socks, a long sleeved shirt and rubber gloves.
- Cut plants to ground level. If they are small, dig them out by the root with a shovel. For larger plants, spray with a weed killer. No not cut with a weed-wacker.
- Dispose of the plants and roots in a plastic bag. **DO NOT COMPOST OR BURN.**
- Disinfect clothes and tools. If you do come into contact with poison ivy use a skin cleaner like Technu and a drying agent like calamine lotion.

Lake Management The results of the water tests for the herbicide residue are in and the levels are low enough to allow for irrigation from the lake. There is an abundance of natural vegetation returning to the lake now that it doesn't have to compete with Curlyleaf for space and giving cover for the schools and schools of baby fish that have hatched this spring. The number of people fishing and boating appears to be up from earlier years and everyone reports that fishing is excellent.

Pedestrian Bridge The bridge will be open very soon after a few safety details are addressed and signs installed. The signs will read as follows, "FOR QLCA MEMBERS ONLY NO TRESPASSING" The Queens Lake board has decided that QLCA members will be allowed to fish from the bridge by obtaining a permit from the office and displaying it while fishing. These permits are free and will be for QLCA members' only. Anyone fishing from the bridge without a permit will be considered trespassing and the York County Sheriff's Office should be called. 757-890-3630

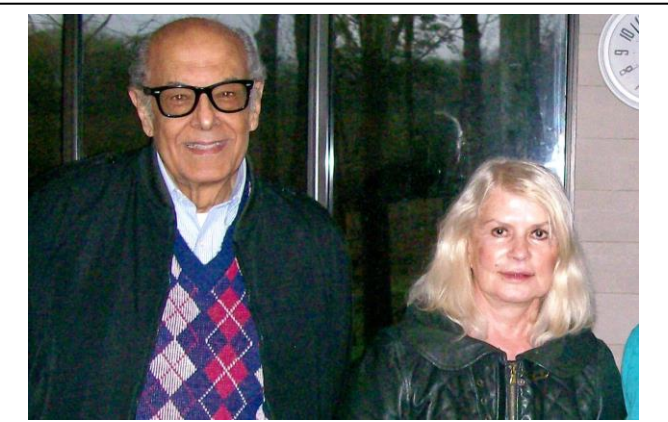
