Lake

LAKE Clarke Aqua Management will again be contracted for weed control and general lake monitoring which includes water quality testing for both Queens Lake and Princess Pond. This year a full lake treatment for currleyleaf pondweed will not be done in favor of a spot treatment program. Clarke will map the lake in February or March to determine new weed growth and treat accordingly. Costs will be much less than previous years as we turn to less aggressive treatment and develop a maintenance program.

New 2019 Boat stickers are available at the office and are required for all and any water craft. 2019 dashboard parking passes are also available for members that park at the boat access areas while using the lake.

Dam & Spillway As soon as water levels return to normal the cracks on the spillway will be sealed with epoxy. We will continue to keep the banks clean of heavy vegetation especially the Creekside bank of the dam which needs to be cut back 25° at bottom to meet regulations.

COMMITTEE MEETING We will have a meeting on January 31st with location and time yet to be determined. The makeup of committee members will be finalized at this meeting. In addition to weed control and general lake the committee will focus on:

- improving the docks at the boat access areas and finding volunteers to monitor these areas monthly or weekly as use increases
- -trash pickup day on the lake
- -have the Virginia Game Department return and do a new fish survey
- -discuss ideas to expand the Boat Parade


General –Our first meeting is tentatively scheduled for 1/29/2019 at the clubhouse.

Updates:

General maintenance – Several weeks ago, a neighbor made us aware of a leak he saw when cycling by the pool. Repairs were made to leaky plumbing in the adult pump room by Clearwater Pool Management. The Marina Committee met on December 10th at the clubhouse. A motion was passed to hold committee meetings the 4th Monday of each month at 7 pm at the clubhouse. All members of the 2018 Marina Committee have agreed to serve again in 2019. As of December 1, there were 54 slips available for rent at the marina and six (6) slip were vacant. One slip renter has given notice that he will not return for 2019.

The Marina Committee forward for action to the QLCA Board at their January 8th meeting the following items: to change the late fees from \$25 per week to \$25 per month; to approve the pricing of slips A 1-9 at the following rates: \$550 members; \$975 limited members; and, to allow for the payment of marina slip and ramp fees via credit card. These items were approved by the Board. The Board did not approve a request by the Marina committee to increase the line item for maintenance & repairs in the 2019 operating budget by \$8,000 to cover purchasing 30 "Harbor Mate" marine power outlets which meet the National Electric Code (NEC) Article 555 requirements for Marina, Boatyards, and Commercial-Noncommercial Docking Facilities. 
