President's Message

Our Board recently hosted the general manager and operations director of a large homeowner association to hear how this community went about developing a strategic plan. While we're not a typical HOA - we don't have covenants, mandatory assessments, or an Architectural Review Board - we do share many of the same challenges, including managing facility expenses and capital reserves. Faced with deferred maintenance and aging facilities, this larger association board and residents came together over several months to develop a 10-year plan to use as a roadmap for critical spending, including an annual 3% assessment increase to offset inflation.

QLCA is also on the right track. Last year we conducted a resident survey to assess interests and priorities for our amenities, notably the pool, clubhouse, racquet courts and marina. If the dam remediation taught us anything, it's that we can't kick the can down the road deferring maintenance or improvements. We need a plan.

One of the most obvious needs is the tennis courts. For the past couple of years, the Recreation Committee focused on resurfacing the courts beginning with converting the upper tennis court to (four) pickleball courts. Repairs to the pool deck, clubhouse exterior and marina bulkhead are also underway or in the initial planning stages. A Strategic Planning Committee was recently formed composed of both new and old members who will use the input from the survey to better interface with the Finance Committee's annual capital reserve study to prioritize repair and replacement costs.

But to keep our facilities in top shape, we will need to manage expectations and costs over the long run. To that end, members of the Strategic Planning Committee and Finance Committee, as well as representatives of each of our four facilities (clubhouse, pool, recreation and marina) will host a special shareholder meeting at 10am, Saturday, June 15th at the clubhouse to share information on budgets, short and long-term needs, and to solicit member input on priorities over the next several years.

There's a lot to love living in "Nature's Neighborhood." We're surrounded by woods and water, close to town and the river, the lake and the park. And some of the best views in Williamsburg from the pool, clubhouse and marina. Belonging to our community association (QLCA) gives you a voice in the community and a stake in the future. Come join us. See you at Queens Lake Day June 22nd!

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

Short-Term Rentals (STR's)

What is happening with STR's at the State level?

According to an excerpt from our District 1 Supervisor, Doug Holroyd's March newsletter: Senate Bills 304 and 544 were brought forward by Airbnb and the Virginia Realtors Association to promote Short Term Rentals (STR) and Auxiliary (Garage) Apartments. These are essentially neighborhood hotels created out of homes within a subdivision and rented on a weekend or weekly basis. The two bills seek to eliminate local jurisdiction and take away citizen's ability to voice their position over Short Term Rentals in residential neighborhoods. HB 304 has been delayed for the season and shifted to 2025. Virginia Governor Ralph Northam adopted the recommendation on April 17, 2024 for Senate Bill 544 (SB544) which is about short-term rental properties and localities' ability to prohibit the use of accessory dwelling units. HB 1461is also on the Governor's desk. This bill allows localities to restrict an Owner to one STR in a community.

What is happening with STR's at the County level?

According to an excerpt from our District 1 Supervisor, Doug Holroyd's March newsletter: The Board of Supervisors (BOS) recently reviewed the status of York County's current guidelines and rules for STRs and were asked to submit proposed changes to the Planning Department. I (Doug Holroyd) have submitted three recommendations:

1. For whole house rentals, Owner must be present onsite or in an adjacent home on the same street. I do not accept a solution where a neighbor is expected to look after the STR while the Owner resides in an entirely different city. I call this 'skin in the game'. The neighbors need to have confidence that the Owner is present and managing the STR operation.

2. Density limit or cap to be applied within each subdivision. I've recommended 1% as currently being debated by City of Hampton. We are seeing far too much of our low to middle cost "affordable" housing being snapped up by investors. It's creating a crisis for younger homebuyers being able to afford starter homes in our community. This issue will, if unchecked, accelerate the migration of youth out of our County.

3. Limit of 1 STR per Property Owner within a Locality. Owning in the City

of Williamsburg, with a JCC or York County address, all are within the same community and would not be permitted.


What is happening with STR's in the QL Neighborhood?

Although STR's are not currently in the neighborhood, the zoning has not changed. The county Short Term Rental regulation limit is the entire home, with absent owners (who can be a corporation), with a designated responsible party who shall be available to promptly respond to and resolve problems or complaints that arise. Large events are possible with additional

permitting. An example is a recent STR approval in Yorktown where a corporation owns the townhouse, and the entire home is rented. In residential zoning, this is all subject to the BOS approval.

In other words, there is no distance or residency requirement for owners/managers to be nearby, and owners don't have to be people. The STR can also be changed annually with approval from the BOS. In other words, if an STR were approved in the neighborhood for just one room in a home, the owners could come back at any time and ask for further expansion of the STR into the whole house. So, in any scenario, we as neighbors must be vigilant in observing changes to STRs because there is no requirement to notify neighbors of STR amendments.

In 2020, over 80% of property owners in Queen's Lake were surveyed about their position on STR's in the neighborhood. Here are the results:



82% of All Property Owners were interviewed accounting for 455 properties

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
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Beautification

The Beautification committee held earth Day 2024 for the members. We had a native plant talk by one of our own Cynthia Abbott. Members learned about the native plants in our area and why they are beneficial. We then moved into a lecture by Megan Ernst, the co-owner of Wild Birds Unlimited. Members learned about what seed draws what birds and what are some of the birds we will see around Queens Lake. During the day, members who participated in the plant sale could stop by the clubhouse and pick up their new plants to add to the beauty surrounding Queens Lake.

In the afternoon, three gardens were open for neighbors to tour. The weather cooperated and everyone observed what can be done with the challenges many of us face in Queens Lake.

Did you know!

Research confirms that "curb appeal" is a thing, adding 7% to home value. If your current landscape is just average, focus your plantings on the front yard, paint the front door, and maybe update the house number and entry light.

Looking to clean up your property from winter and spring storms? Did you know?

Curbside Yard Debris Collections

Acceptable material size for curbside pickup is 8" diameter and 10' feet in length.

All residents who subscribe to the York County curbside solid waste program may schedule two yard debris collections per month (approximately 24 cubic yards) at a rate of \$25 per collection. Each additional load collected within 30 days after the first collection will be an additional \$100 per load. Non subscribers to the solid waste program may schedule up to two collections within a 30 day period at a rate of \$75 per collection.

Loose yard debris, grass, leaves and straw must be placed in clear bags.

Stumps, dirt or debris with dirt, construction debris, and other materials cannot be collected.

Scheduled materials must be at the front roadside by 7:00 a.m. Monday of your collection week.



The Lake Committee sent out an RFP for lake consultant services last month and will be reviewing proposals and qualifications to make recommendations for annual contract services. The Committee will also initiate a discussion with York Co Director of Public Works to ensure services include monitoring water quality.

York County Public Works staff is finalizing plans for stormwater project to include identification of private easements to access ravines necessary for construction access and to avoid project delays.

Discussions are continuing with Congressman Wittman's after his site visit on April 3rd. York Co District 1 Supervisor Doug Holroyd, is taking the lead to obtain a cost estimate from consultants that will be used to solicit federal support. A community forum will be scheduled to provide details.

The Lake Committee hosted first ever "Lakeapalooza" family day on the Lake with a fishing derby, canoe/kayak race and refreshments April 27. Many thanks to Kia and Greg Rippel, Monty Fleck, and Chris Hager for organizing. Here's hoping for better weather next year!
