

Tennis Court Rules

1. Queens Lake Tennis Courts are for the use of paid up members of the Association and their guests.
2. Rules for Guests. Residents of Queens Lake are not eligible to use the courts unless they are Tennis Court members. Guests must be accompanied by a member. House guests of members may play with a member at any time.
3. All players must wear regulation soled tennis shoes. Shoes with soles (including leather) which may scuff or mark the playing surfaces are not permitted. Playing in bare feet is prohibited.
4. Hitting against the backboard is permitted only between 8:00 a.m. & 10:00 p.m.
5. Playing Time Limitations. When other players are waiting, playing time will be limited to one hour (60 minutes) for singles and one and one-half hours (90 minutes) for doubles. The time rule for singles applies to a court originally taken for singles play but changed to doubles upon arrival of two more players unless players 3 and 4 arrive within 5 minutes of players 1 and 2. For example, if players 3 and 4 arrive 15 minutes after players 1 and 2, players 3 and 4 will have 45 minutes playing time at the end of which all four players must vacate the court.
6. Lights for night play may be operated manually until 10:00 p.m. at which time they are turned off by an automatic timer. Lights should be turned off manually when finished playing whether before or at 10:00 p.m.
7. A court may not be “held” by a single player when other players are present and waiting to play.
8. Children of Queens Lake Association members. Children 13 years and older may use the courts without parent supervision, but the parents will still be responsible for their actions. Parents need to review the use of the locks with their children so they know how to secure the courts after play. Children who do not reside with their parents are eligible to join at member rates. All other non-residents of Queens Lake will pay special membership rates.
9. The tennis courts may not be used for any activity other than tennis. This is your facility so please monitor it and keep the courts neat and clean.
